



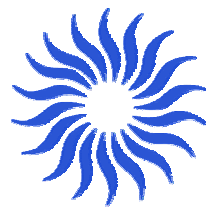

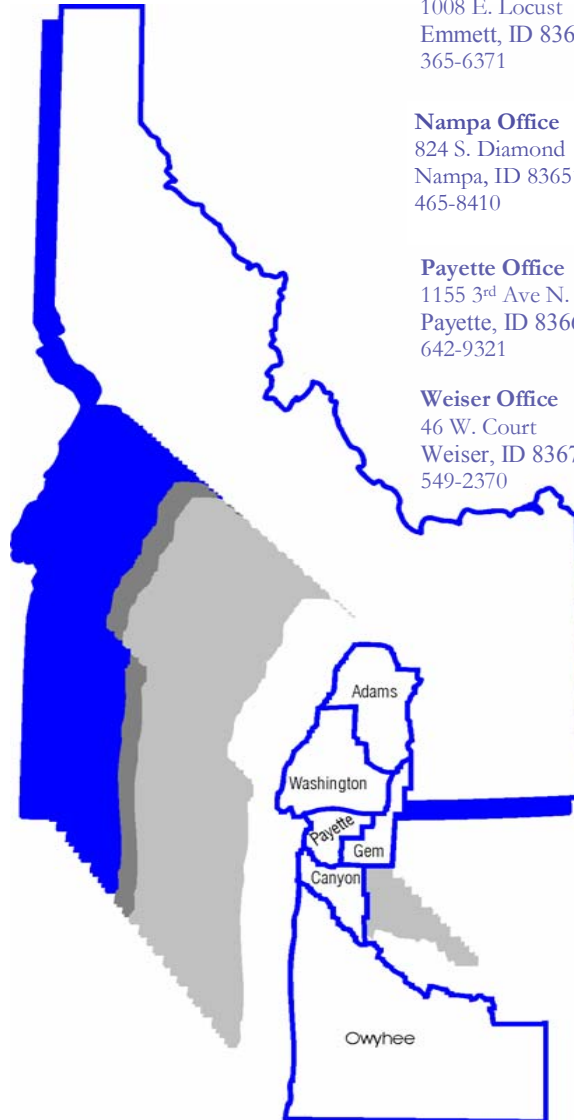

Foreign Travel Services

Purpose:

Planning an enjoyable foreign travel experience should begin well before the first suitcase is packed. An important way to protect your loved ones and yourself when traveling in other countries is through a complete series of immunizations. The Southwest District Health travel clinic provides comprehensive immunization and health education services for area residents who are planning international travel. Services are available Monday through Friday by appointment only. See phone numbers on the back of the brochure for your nearest Southwest District Health office.

Completing the Foreign Travel Process:

- ✦ Contact Southwest District Health for a screening interview. You will be asked questions about your travel destination and health history so a Health District travel expert can research the immunization protection you need.
- ✦ A customer service representative will schedule an appointment for your travel immunizations following your screening interview.
- ✦ Visit your nearest Southwest District Health office for your scheduled appointment. Allow about 45 minutes for the visit. There will be a \$35 consultation fee in addition to vaccine costs.
- ✦ World Health Organization cards will be provided to those receiving Yellow Fever vaccinations.



Travel Immunizations Provided by Southwest District Health:

- ✦ Hepatitis A
- ✦ Hepatitis B
- ✦ Influenza
- ✦ Measles, Mumps, Rubella
- ✦ Pneumococcal Disease
- ✦ Polio
- ✦ Tetanus/Diphtheria
- ✦ Typhoid
- ✦ Varicella (chickenpox)
- ✦ Yellow Fever

Preparing for Your Appointment:

Call your local Health District several weeks before traveling to allow for vaccines that must be given in a series of multiple shots. For maximum protection, vaccinations against some diseases must be given six months before departure. Keep in mind that although children may have been immunized against diseases like polio and measles, your physician may recommend a booster shot to protect against disease that are prevalent in developing countries.

Bring the following with you:

- ✦ Previous immunization history.
- ✦ A detailed travel itinerary that includes your travel destination(s) and the dates you will be visiting.
